Manuscripts normally will be sent out for blind review. Authors are expected to provide an electronic copy as an e-mail attachment. Shorter articles (6000 words) are preferred, although longer manuscripts will be considered. Chicago style, with endnotes, is preferred, but APA and MLA will be accepted. Abbreviate frequently cited book titles, particularly books by Polanyi (e.g., *Personal Knowledge* becomes PK). Writers are encouraged to employ simple citations within the text when possible. Because the journal serves English writers across the world, we do not require anybody's "standard English." Consistency and clear writing are expected, however.
